



Our endowment funds, donor advised funds, and supporting foundations, combined with the annual Campaign for Jewish Needs and Centennial Initiative for Jewish Cleveland fundraising, make the Federation one of Ohio's largest grantmaking organizations — with over \$111 million allocated from all sources in the 2021 fiscal year.

Includes part of United Way of Greater Cleveland (UWGC) grant of \$1,291,000. UWGC supports Bellefaire, JFSA, Mandel JCC and the Federation.
 Includes Centennial Initiative grants.
 From the annual Campaign after deducting fundraising cost of under 8.9 percent, one of the lowest overhead costs of any charitable organization in Ohio.
