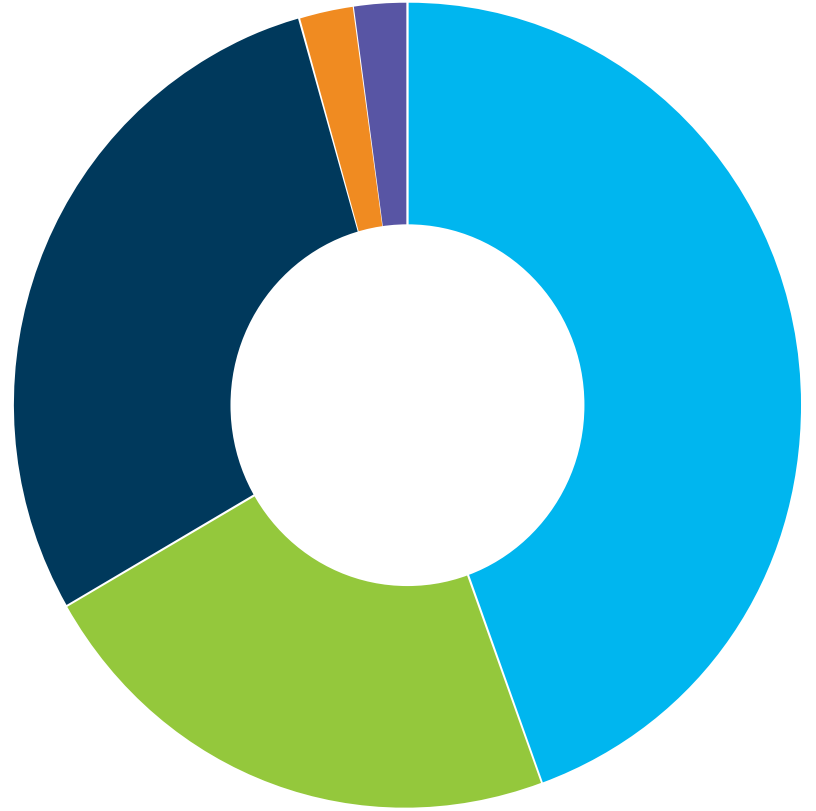

### Sources of Funds

In addition to the 2023 Campaign, the Federation received and allocated \$1,291,000 from United Way Services, and \$350,000 from Prior Year Collections. Those dollars supplemented allocations to partner agencies to fund unmet community needs.

**Total funds allocated after allowances for Campaign costs, collections and centrally administered services were \$31,966,049.**
